## FFA Participates in Range Judging

Twenty eight members of the Diller-Odell FFA Chapter and seven junior high students participated in the area range judging contest held northwest of Tecumseh. The event was sponsored by the Nemaha Natural Resource District and the Natural Resources Conservation Service with assistance from the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission and Cooperative Extension. The participants were required to identify twenty-four different range plants by their common name and to list the life form, life span, origin, season of growth, forage value, and root growth form of each. They also evaluated the range condition of three sites, calculated livestock stocking rates, and determine pasture improvement practices.

Diller-Odell's members took first in both the junior and senior divisions in the team and individual competitions. There were 171 individual students and 43 teams participating in the event. The top senior team of Cody Scheele, Ethan Rupprecht, Theresa Zarybnicky, and Katie Schultis took the Grand Champion Team award with the highest score of all teams in either division. Ranking highest in the junior team division was Adam Schultis, Reese Hennerberg, Joslyn Edmond, and Caleb Schultis. In other results in the senior division, the team of Kai

Wendland, Zach Rash, Bailey Schroeder, and Calvin Hennerberg placed second; and the team of Bladen Ahl, Camille Hennerberg, and Elliot Sasse place tenth. In the junior division, the team of Jonathan Schimdt, Spencer Schimdt, Christian McCown, and Dylan Wolbert placed second; Cory Engelman, Jesse Scheele, Kaleb Rupprecht, and Bryston Warren placed fourth; Morgan Phillips, Kirsten Bures, Ashley Yocum, and Kelsey Schlichtman placed fifth; T.J. Schroeder, Andrew Hamel, Corina Lottman, and Alexis Craw placed sixth.

Out of 67 participants, individual recognition in the senior division was awarded to Cody Scheele for first place; Ethan Rupprecht for second; Theresa

Zarybnicky for third; Kai Wendland for fourth; Calvin Hennerberg for sixth; Katie Schultis for eighth; Zach Rash for ninth; and Camille Hennerberg for tenth.

Out of 104 participants in the junior

division, Dylan Wolbert placed first; Adam Schultis second; Jesse Scheele third; Spencer Schmidt fourth; Reese Hennerberg fifth; Bryston Warren eighth; Joslyn Edmond ninth; and Kelsey Schlichtman tenth.

## KC Wolf Makes a Visit to Elementary to Kick of Their "Fuel Up to Play 60" Program

For over a week the Diller-Odell Elementary students had been patiently waiting for Wednesday Oct. 22 to arrive so they could find out who their "size 22 shoe wearing surprise guest speaker" would be. This guest was arriving to help the school cooks, teachers, and students kick of their Fuel Up to Play 60 program. This program was started last year and will continue strong in this 2013-14 school year. It

is a nationwide movement focused on fighting childhood obesity by empowering kids to take control of their own health. The Midwest Dairy Council, along with Americas Dairy Farmers, Farm Credit Services of America and our local Classic Dairy, have teamed up to bring the Fuel Up program to Diller-Odell. Ronda Duis & Jen Wendland work in our elementary cafeteria and strive daily to make available nutrient-rich foods for the kids. One way this is done is on the new salad bar that was brought in last year. This new addition is thanks to Kayla Colgrove, extension agent and dietician. Kayla also won a dietician contest last year, which enabled her to bring KC Wolf to our school as her prize for winning. Along with the nutrient-rich foods, kids are also encouraged to partake in AT LEAST 60 minutes of daily

physical activity.

Beth Upton of the Midwest Dairy Council presented certificates to the following for their assistance in getting this program to our school: Ann & Brooke Engelman of Classic Dairy, Ronda Duis, Jen Wendland, Dusty Duis (School Nurse), & Rita Becker (Guidance Counselor). After the award presentation, KC Wolf, removed his costume and became Dan Meers. Dan has worn the wolf costume since 1989 and is also a motivational speaker. He spoke to the kids about exercising, eating well and his time as a mascot.

Here are some facts that Dan provided the students with:

### 7 Benefits to Exercise:

- \*Improves your mood.
- \*Fights sickness and disease.
- \*Gives you healthy bones and muscles.
- \*Strengthens your heart and lungs.
- \*Helps you sleep better.
- \*Gives you more energy.
- \*and can be FUN!

Meers stressed that eating well means following the MyPlate template. **Daily intake of the food groups should be:**

- \*3-4 servings of low or no-fat DAIRY.
- \*2-3 servings PROTEIN.
- \*2-4 servings VEGGIES.
- \*2-4 servings FRUIT.
- \*6-11 servings GRAINS (preferably whole grain).

The school CAN'T be alone in this! You, as a parent, need to talk to your children daily. Ask them about lunch, encourage them to think about what they are putting in their body and making the best choices for taking care of it!

### Teamwork. Positive Attitude. Skill. Leadership. Coaching. Fun. Support

After watching the Griffin Varsity Volleyball team win the Conference Championship, it is hard for me to pick which of those words was most important in their victory. It seems each word is as equally important as the next, and that is just how the girls play, each knowing their job and that each team member is just as important as the other one.

The Griffin team, and Coach Kandice Jurgens do have a goal of making it to the State Tournament, but seemed to be focused on taking it one step at a time...one game at a time.

Although I played all sports available in high school, I was never a star athlete of any. But, I was fortunate to be part of a team my senior year that was very successful, coming up runner up at District Volleyball. I have watched A LOT of sports and teams play, especially on the high school level. I have witnessed 2 family members win State Basketball titles. Now I am watching my girls become involved.

On the flip side, I have witnessed teams fail. Teams that had extreme potential. Teams that were filled to the rim with talent. Teams that fans anticipated even before they began playing. Those same teams that came up short. What happened? What went wrong?

All this being said, I have put a good amount of thought into what it takes to being a successful team.

1. **Teamwork.** A must. Whether there are 5, 6, 8, 10...members on the field or court, they ALL have to interact with each other physically and

verbally to make it work.

2. **Positive Attitude:** All it takes is ONE team member to have a bad attitude. This will instantly disrupt the chemistry of any good team. A bad attitude will stifle good talent and any chance of fun and victory.

3. **Skill:** Of course, you need some of this. But, I was part of a team who wasn’t “full” of skill, but we had all of the other areas covered so well, we worked!

4. **Leadership:** Everyone can have some leadership skills on a team, but it does take one or two players that the other players count on to pump the team up, to give advice and to help the team play its best. When things are going wrong, they can count on this person to keep their spirits up. These leaders will only be successful if they play their role with a POSITIVE attitude, they CAN NOT be negative or condescending.

5. **Coaching.** A good coach figures out which players work the best together, how to use each player’s talent in the best way. The coaches are able to see each player as they are practicing, to get a feel for their attitude and if they want to work hard and work together. Sometimes this takes all season, but hopefully all “kinks” get worked out by seasons end.

6. **Fun:** Fun usually comes

with winning, but it also may lead to winning. A team does its best when it can find the right balance between fun and work. The “fun” will just fit in seamlessly and help the team and fans rise up to victory.

7. **Support:** This all comes only with SUPPORT from family, friends, and fans! Fans need to stay positive and happy!

So, what makes a successful TEAM? This TEAM will have a coach who works with each member to bring out their best, who finds the right mix of individual talent and chemistry. This TEAM has a positive attitude, both in each individual and in the TEAM as a whole. This TEAM has a leader who is willing to take charge without bringing anyone down. This TEAM has full support of those around them. If all this works out, then the TEAM will be having fun, using their skills, and WINNING!
